

#### FY 2015 DBE Report Summary

During 2015 a total number of 14,267 DBE contracts were awarded for a total of \$1,834,958,203.67 in awards and commitments.



Of the total number of contracts awarded 8,173 were awarded to NonMinority DBE firms.



On Thursday, September 17th, The Congressional Black Caucus brought together a distinguished panel of federal, state and local officials, including Rep. Elijah E. Cummings and experts in the transportation industry for the

"Transportation Braintrust: Embracing Innovation, Inspiring Leaders and Bridging Opportunities." The purpose of the transportation focused panel was to educate congressional representatives about the issues affecting people of color in the US (i.e. streets and highways, public transportation, trains etc). A broad spectrum of ideas was discussed, including ones facing local communities, minority suppliers, contractors and vendors.

One of the main points discussed during the event was the "Grow America" proposal. The 6 year proposal seeks to modernize our infrastructure while growing the national economy by providing significant workforce opportunities in communities of color. The blueprint boasts a budget of \$478 billion to make sure that our US transportation system is safe, secure for users and on par with our counterparts in other leading countries.

Representing the National Association of Minority Contractors, President of the organization, Mr. Stemley, stressed and was successful in being part of the collaborative that helped get the long term surface transportation bill passed (HR 22 – representing \$350 billion its first year) and the need for compliance and enforcement of the federal DBE program.

#### NAMC National Sows a Seed to Help Preserve an American Treasure



"Mrs. Tubman's legacy and her contribution to the betterment of our

Harriet Tubman was referred to as the "Moses" of her time and is best known for her role as a conductor on the <u>Underground Railroad</u>. She rendered service to the Union Army during the Civil War and then settled in Auburn, New York.

Plans are underway to build a new interpretive center in Auburn to share her story and legacy. "We look forward to a continued collaboration with NAMC and having minority contractors involved in the project," said Karen Hill, President & CEO, The Harriet Tubman Home.
